From the Pastor:

"Revive! Renew! Rejoice!" That is the theme of my 2017 sabbatical; a balance of rest to revive my body, mind, and soul; renewal of relationships with family and friends; rejoicing in the learning of new things; and travel to new places. I look forward to wiping the dust off the pile of ministry and other books I have desired to read for a long time, experiencing various styles of worship, attending the American Baptist Biennial in Portland Oregon (preceded by visiting with cousins and friends in California) and attending "Rhythms of the Spirit," a five-day retreat in August. I believe that this three month time away from pastoral duties will have an immeasurably positive impact on my ministry as a pastor and upon my personal life so that I may be revived, renewed, and freely rejoice in the grace of God.

I will be taking two weeks vacation (May 22 – June 4) to wind down as I enter into sabbatical. It usually takes me close to a week just to catch up on sleep and begin to feel rested. Getting a head start on being *revived* before engaging in any of the planned activities for my sabbatical will give me a physical and emotional advantaged to better enjoy the more structured elements over the three months. During the second week of vacation, we are taking a family trip to celebrate Andrew's graduation from college.

Throughout the Sabbatical, I look forward to visiting various churches to rejoice in the Lord while experiencing differing styles of worship. Jim and I delight in stepping out of our comfort zone, being open to the moving of the Holy Spirit in both more reserved traditions as well as ones that have a more charismatic flare. The sabbatical will allow me to worship in communities where I am anonymous to the congregation. I will intentionally visit churches of various ethnicities and denominations and will reflect on what aspects of worship and fellowship might work (or <u>not</u> work) in our church. We will definitely bring such observations back to Greenville Baptist Church.

Having time to truly be revived and renewed will no doubt allow my frame of mind to be one that is more inclined to rejoice in all areas of my life. When I am well rested, my attitude is positive, my mind sharper, my vision clearer and my creativity more innovative. That is the kind of person I aspire to be – and the kind of person I enjoy being around! Does not the congregation deserve to have a pastor that is open to new ideas and one that is rested enough to be truly attentive to important issues that the church faces amongst its members as well as in the world in the 21st century? Would not the congregants be empowered to take better care of their own spiritual health and growth when they see how the pastor has grown by taking the time to focus on her spiritual, physical and emotional needs? I will be excited to share my sabbatical experiences, and as I teach and preach, inspired by the new things I have learned, I hope that it will reignite the congregants' desire to study deeper and experience more about the Christian faith and to embrace anew the power of the Holy Spirit that continues to transform lives, congregations and communities.

As I prepare for the sabbatical period, I have been working with the Deacons to make sure that if any pastoral emergencies arrive, the congregation will know who and what numbers to call. Sue, Chair of Deacons, and Paula, Chair of Pastoral Relations, will be checking in regularly with Rev. Don Rasmussen, sabbatical interim, with any issues or concerns within the congregation; especially illness or hospitalizations.

I will be working until Sunday, May 21. Although I will not see you for three months, I will continue to pray for the church and all of its members – and I hope you will remember me in your prayers!


Upcoming Sabbatical Period – June, July and August

Meet our Interim Minister for the Sabbatical Period Monday, June 5 – Sunday, September 3, 2017

Rev. Dr. Donald R. Rasmussen

Born October 11, 1939 in New York City, Don then lived in upstate New York while in high school and college.

After seminary, his first ministry was at Jackson Street Baptist Church in Scranton, Pennsylvania, where he was ordained and served for four years as Minister of Education. In 1968, he and his family moved to Rhode Island where he served for 28+ years as Assistant, Associate, and Senior Pastor of Phillips Memorial Baptist Church. On January 1, 1997, he began service as Executive Minister of the American Baptist Churches of Rhode Island. He retired from that position on January 1, 2007.



In retirement, he has worked with Natural Church Development[©], tutored English as a second language, enjoyed RV travel with his five grandchildren. Presently Don and Ginny serve as volunteers at ABCORI's Motter Resource center and at the American Baptist Historical Society in Atlanta.

Both Don and Ginny have served on the General Board of the American Baptist Churches USA and have 14 years of combined experience as members of that board. Don served as chair of the Credentials and Caucus Committee and on the Board of National Ministries on the Finance Committee and on the Social and Ethical Responsibility in Investments Committee which he chaired. He also served on the board of the Ministers and Missionaries Benefit Board. As the executive minister, Don served on the Regional Executive Ministers Council as secretary/treasurer and on the General Executive Council of the denomination.

During his time serving Rhode Island Baptists, Don instituted an Elder Care Ministry program with a full-time director; initiated electronic information distribution, reorganized and merged the denomination and camp staffs; built a new office facility, developed the Motter Resource center for pastors; began a "missionary in residence" program and increased volunteer help. His greatest joy in ministry is the eleven

members of Phillips Memorial that entered professional ministry during his tenure as pastor.

Prior to the Sabbatical, the pastor will be taking 2 weeks vacation – May 22 – June 4. Rev. Rasmussen will begin June 5.

Greenville Baptist Church -- 50 years ago

What did the True Blue Circle do in 1967? The Annual report states that the group was very busy. Programs included a guest speaker, Mrs. Brenton Arthur, who showed slides of a missionary family in Thailand, a Japanese Holiday party with Japanese decorations, refreshments and tea. In place of Christmas gifts,



dollars were placed on a Ming tree and the proceeds sent to Beulah McCoy, a missionary who taught at a girls' school in Sendai, Japan. (Her mother, Minnie McCoy lived next to the Church House where the driveway and grassy area is now located). Other projects included sending 4 CARE packages, holding a shower for Mather School in which 68 pounds of new and used clothing were sent, collected money from the women to be sent to South Providence Christian Center, sent 120 lbs. of good used clothing to Church World Service, contributed to Smithfield Scholarship Fund, contributed and delivered May Baskets to the RI Medical Center.

A new project that year was the baking of cookies and sending them to service men from our church. They also hosted the American Baptist Women's Spring Meeting in June. This is just a partial listing of what the True Blue Circle accomplished fifty years ago – more info next month.

The following is the Mission Statement and Covenant of True Blue Circle:

In commitment to Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and to the mission of the Church, and through the enabling of the Holy Spirit, American Baptist Women's Ministries provides opportunities for each woman and girl to: become and develop as God's person, build God's faith community, and serve God's world.

Mindful of the millions who are still in darkness because they know not that the son of righteousness has arisen with healing in His wings, remembering the words of Christ who said, "I am the light of the world" and again "Ye are the light of the world," I gratefully pledge myself to work henceforth with Him, giving time, money, and prayer that upon such as sit in darkness and shadow of death, the Light of life may shine.
