I was pleased to receive the email from your pastor last winter asking if I would fill in with you during her summer sabbatical. I agreed to Sunday mornings plus a half day during the week. I will be at the church by 2:30 p.m. on Wednesdays, (except for August 2), so if you'd like to talk with me, I'll be available then. My wife, Ginny, will be in worship here when she isn't in another church functioning as president of the American Baptist Women of RI. Many here know her better than you know me but I hope that by the pastor's return, that score will be leveled up a bit.

I have a keen interest in the mission of the church and I'm so pleased with your work each year in Honduras. Toward the end of my interim during worship, I will focus on mission and tell a couple of remarkable stories – one that began right here in Rhode Island.

It's a wise church that offers a pastoral sabbatical – Phillips Memorial provided one for me in 1990. The president of the Baptist Seminary in Stockholm Sweden and I exchanged homes for four months, May – August. During that time away, Ginny and I worked on hospitality and visioning our future and how we could best serve the future of the church. It resulted in building an addition to provide access for all via a campaign titled "Reaching for Tomorrow". The campaign was easily subscribed and created great enthusiasm and a wonderful sense of future promise. So, when your pastor returns, be prepared for new, creative visions for the future.

After three weeks I have found a cordial welcome here and have been quite impressed with the church leadership and program. This church is a stand-out in the life of ABCORI and it is an honor to be asked to serve God alongside you this summer.

#### FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The re-glazing, priming, and painting of the exterior of twenty-four (24) windows and three (3) doors in the Sanctuary, Lower Vestry, and Church Office is scheduled to be completed before the end of June.

The National Grid/RISE project to refurbish or replace lighting fixtures with LED components in the Fellowship Hall lower level, stairwell to upper level (north), upper hallway (north), hallway at office, office, lower vestry (all), and exterior lights (all) is underway. The materials were delivered on June 20<sup>th</sup>, and the actual installation will continue in July.

Discussion regarding the existing sign board at the intersection of Putnam Pike with Church Street continues. Pictures of existing church signs will be taken. Smithfield zoning regulations will be reviewed, and a possible sign location will be marked on the ground for further review.

of William, Henry and Stephen Brown, Nahum Leach, Mary Hurdis, Franklin Lockwood, Charles J. Needham, Wayland Fiske, Lester Leonard and John McGrillies (John created and installed all of the stained glass windows).

Fran and Walter Green donated the hymnal boards and numerals, which are still in use today, in the sanctuary. The flower stands, in the pulpit area were given by Jim and Ethel Cummings. (Sue Caffeso's parents).

This last donation, I found quite unexpectedly, "A gift towards the ELEVATOR FUND was given in memory of Earl Knight". (Finally used 48 years later)

These names might be forgotten but I'm sure that some of our "senior" members may remember a few. Next 1967 Memories will be in the September Newsletter. Enjoy the summer! Jeanie Buckley
